come to me shall not hunger; you who believe in me
shall never thirst.

**People: In the company of all who hunger for spiritual food,
we come to this table to know the risen Christ in
the sharing of this life-giving bread.**

The Eucharistic Prayer

Liturgist: May the God of steadfast love be with you.

People: And also with you!

Liturgist: People of God, offer your hearts to God.

People: We open our hearts to the One who fills them with grace.

Liturgist: Children of God, sing your praises to the One who has gathered us here.

People: Our songs of joy travel to the very ends of creation.

Liturgist: Almighty God, Creator and Sustainer of life, Your majesty and power, Your continued blessings, and Your great goodness fill us with wonder. We are unworthy of the pardon You have in mercy given us. We can only bring our thanks, putting our trust in Your Son, who alone saves us from evil. Therefore, in joy, with the prophets, apostles, martyrs, and saints in every time and place, we sing Your praise:

Nicaea

Holy, Holy, Holy, One God Almighty!

**All Your works shall praise Thy name in earth and sky
and sea.**

Holy, Holy, Holy! Hosanna in the highest!

Blessed is the Christ who comes to set us free.

Liturgist: Holy are You, God of all goodness and truth, and blessed is Jesus, Your Child, our Savior. It was He who came, bone of our bone and flesh of our flesh, with words which could transform our foolishness, with weakness which could strengthen our fatigued faithfulness, with wisdom which could teach us the way of life in all its

fullness. Yet, we were offended by His life, His ways, His humility. He continued to listen to You, going wherever You sent him - no glory, no wealth, no honor - even to that place called Calvary where sin's thorns crowned Him. Your grace was enough for Him, even in the cold shadows of the tomb, and He walked forth into your steadfast love, leaving death behind in the dust.

**All: Christ came, to shape our lives like His;
Christ came, to be our Guide forever;
Christ will come again, to gather us in glory.**

Liturgist: So now, in this place where we have heard Your promises, among these people in whom we have seen the Christ, pour Your Spirit upon the gifts of Your Table. The broken Bread of life is all we need of hope, for with that hope we can go forth to anoint the lost and hopeless with the oil of Your compassion. Your Cup of grace overflows, more than we will ever need, and more than enough to bring healing to those who have known only hardship, rejection, and loneliness. And when at the end of all time, we discover that it was You who had led us all along the way and brought us to the Table in glory, we will join our voices as one, singing our praise to You, God in Community, Holy in One. Amen.
