The Sacrament of Holy Communion

The Approach

Liturgist: Our Lord said to us: I am the bread of life. You who come to me shall not hunger; you who believe in me shall never thirst.

People: In the company of all who hunger for spiritual food, we come to this table to know the risen Christ in the sharing of this life-giving bread.

The Eucharistic Prayer

Liturgist: May the Spirit-sharing God be with you!

People: And also with you!

Liturgist: Come to the One who breathes new life into us.

People: Here are our hearts, O God. Renew them!

Liturgist: Sing to God as long as you live.

People: Our songs will be offered as long as we have life.

Liturgist: On the last day of chaos, Holy God, You sent
Your Spirit to move over and through creation:
in violent storms which crashed waves upon beaches;
in the volcano which pushed up mountains;
and in the dove which sailed softly in dawn's pink skies.
Scooping up earth in your hands, your Breath gave life
to those shaped in Your image, so that we might rejoice
in You forever. But drunk on the wine of free will, we
followed those false prophets named sin and death.
You would not leave us in their empty rooms, sending
Wisdom on those men and women who spoke to us of
Your dreams. Yet, we drenched the fire of Your love with
our tears of rebellion. So, giving flesh to Your heart,
You sent Jesus to us, so we might be given new life.

With those who share the Spirit, with those who try to
keep the Spirit at arm's length, we sing our songs of
thanksgiving to You:

**All: Holy, holy, holy are You, God of power and peace.
All creation joins You in praising your works.
Hosanna in the highest!
Blessed is the One who fills the thirsty.
Hosanna in the highest!**

Liturgist: We bless You, Lord of all creation, for Your Spirit which
filled Jesus Christ, our Hope, our Brother, our Savior.
When the world knocks every cup out of our hands,
he pours Your living waters into our parched souls.
When the world puts its finger to our lips, silencing our
lives, He comes, to gift us with the words which transform.
When death would snatch life's breath from us, He comes,
to fill us with the Spirit of resurrection which raised Him

from the grave. As He would baptize us in the Spirit, as He would have us share the good news, we sing of that faith grounded in mystery:

**All: Christ gave His last breath for us;
God raised Christ, filling Him with the breath of new life;
the Spirit will breathe life into us, until Christ comes again.**

Liturgist: On this day, in this place, with those gathered around us, we pray that Your Spirit of holy chaos would be poured out upon the Table and on Your people. The bread is broken, its gritty hope offering life to all. Grace spills out of the cup, until even the farthest outsider is drenched. Here we discover that in weakness, we can share Your strength with those beaten down by the world; in vulnerability, we can become that power which breaks the bonds of injustice; in death, we can share that life which is given for all. And when You gather us in that upper room of love, sisters from every time, brothers from every place, we will sing our praises to You forever, God in Community, Holy in One.
